PAGFINGS AND SUFFINGS

Focus:

Prefixes and suffixes are added to base words to change the meaning.



Have you ever been to the movies? What do you watch before the actual movie begins? If you said previews--you are correct! Check out the word *preview*. There are two parts; the base word and the prefix. The base word is the main part of the word. A prefix is a letter or group of letters that is added to the beginning of the base word. Prefixes have their own meaning, which in turn changes the meaning of the entire word. In the word preview, the prefix is *pre* and the base word is *view*. *Pre* means before. View means to see or watch. Therefore, the term preview means to watch something before a certain time. If you know the meaning of a certain prefix, you can often figure out words that use that prefix. For example, what do you think pretest means? What about preplan?

Here are some prefixes to remember:
